What is Listening and Spoken Language?




Auditory skills

Teaching a child how to listen and talk begins with detection, comprehension, identification, and discrimination of sounds around them using their hearing aids or cochlear implants.

Communication skills

Expressing the self through spoken language (English, Spanish, Hawaiian, etc) is the next step in learning to communicate.



Social-emotional Development

Children who are DHH require explicit teaching for connecting with others and understanding their emotions.

Self-advocacy

Helping children who are deaf or hard of hearing to speak up, ask for what they need, and to know when they aren't able to hear the teacher, a friend, a parent, etc.
