March is Trisomy Awareness Month. What is Trisomy? Trisomy is the existence of a single extra chromosome in any individual's 23 pairs of chromosomes, resulting in 47 chromosomes instead of 46. Meet Tre'. (ID: Tre, an African American toddler with Trisomy 12p has his hair pulled up in a bun and is wearing glasses and a kerchief style bib. He has a large smile as he looks at his mother, Ginger.) Tre' lives with Trisomy 12p. Tre' is loving, energetic, and inquisitive. There are only 40 documented medical cases of Trisomy 12p in the world. Most children do not survive after five weeks old.
