National Park Access

Resource Sheet. Created June 2023 This is meant to serve as a resource. Please do your due diligence!

Lifetime Disability Access passes are available for those of us who have permanent disabilities, which includes hearing (and/or vision) loss. This means lifetime access to any national park in the United States, which include the national parks in Hawai'i. This pass is also available for children (and the family accompanying the child enter for free).

How to Apply for Lifetime National Parks Access

There are two ways to apply, in person or through the mail. Either way, you will need to have documentation of your (or your child's) disability. Acceptable documentation includes a photocopy of PERMANENT disability documentation issues by Social Security Disability, Office of Veteran Affairs and/or a licensed physician.

- The Mail Print and complete the application and mail it in along with your disability documentation and \$10 for processing. The application is linked here: <u>https://store.usgs.gov/access-pass</u>
