Accessibility Laws

- **Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA):** Ensures access to state and local governments, public accommodations, business facilities, transportation, & telecommunication
- **Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA):** Ensures students receive a free and appropriate education (IEP)
- **Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973:** Ensures all programs receiving federal money provide communication access
- **Hawaii Civil Rights Law:** Ensures access similar to the ADA, but it includes all persons (with or without disabilities)
