

Tax Exemptions for Deaf

This resource provides some information and links regarding the Home and Income Tax Exemptions for Deaf in Hawaii. Please use this information as an aid and do your own due diligence in investigating!

The State of Hawaii offers disability tax exemptions. The disability needs to be certified by a physician.

To qualify as deaf, “an individual whose average loss in the speech frequencies (500 to 2,000 hertz) in the better ear is 92 decibels or such other level as may be supported by A.N.S.I. or worse”

Real Property Tax Exemption

If you own your property or lease through Hawaiian Homelands, you may be qualified for property tax exemption.
